RECOGNIZING SEPTEMBER 2014 AS RECOVERY MONTH
IN THE CITY OF CORCORAN

- WHEREAS,** an individual's behavioral health is an essential part of one's overall wellness; and
- WHEREAS,** prevention works, treatment is effective, and people can and do recover from substance use and mental disorders; and
- WHEREAS,** all people have the fundamental and inherent value to be accepted and treated with respect, human dignity, and worth; and
- WHEREAS,** individuals should have access to fully participate in community life including economic advancement and prosperity; fair and decent housing; quality education; positive opportunities to benefit from and contribute to material, cultural, and social progress; and
- WHEREAS,** it is critical to educate our policymakers, friends and family members, health care providers, and businesses that substance use and mental disorders are treatable, and that people should seek assistance for these conditions, with the same urgency as they would any other health condition; and
- WHEREAS,** all Americans have the opportunity to access provisions within the Affordable Care Act and Mental Health Parity and Addictions Equity Act (MHPAEA), aimed to improve physical and emotional health while ensuring people will receive the care they need at a more reasonable cost; and
- WHEREAS,** substance use and mental disorders are serious public health problems. The White House Office of National Drug Control Policy estimates that only 2.3 million Americans received treatment for a substance use disorder out of an estimated 23 million adult Americans who suffer from a substance use disorder or dependence, we must continue to reach the millions more who need help; and
- WHEREAS,** to help more people achieve long-term recovery, and learn how recovery positively benefits the Nation's overall well-being, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), and Kings County Behavioral Health invite all residents of Kings County to participate in National Recovery Month: Prevention Works, Treatment is Effective, People Recover; and
- WHEREAS,** Kings County Behavioral Health, The Kings County Partnership for Prevention, and other community groups will be hosting the 10th Annual Kings County Recovery Festival on September 6, 2014, a community event to help celebrate recovery, promote a drug-free life style; and

Discussion:

Staff received a written request for funding from the Kings County Commission on Aging (KCCOA). In 2013, \$800 in assistance was funded. Attached is a completed donation request form and 2013-14 budget sheet from KCCOA. Sharon DeMasters representing Kings County Commission on Aging will be at the meeting to answer questions.

The amount being requested for F/Y 2014-15 from the City of Corcoran is for \$7500 and will be utilized as leverage/match for existing funding for the Congregate and Home delivered meals program. Although any amount the Council can assist with would be appreciated.

Staff reviewed the request and recommends there is a relationship to the public agency since this is a "service agency." The nature of the benefit could be, "The Agency is supportive of the Senior Nutrition Program. All citizens of Corcoran benefit from this program since our valued senior residents will receive necessary nutrients to assist them in maintaining a level of productivity. This program provides a service that the City does not offer."

Budget Impact:

In 2012-13, the Council Grants & Contributions budget (also known as "Funding Donation Requests") was reduced from \$5,000 to \$1,000. Due to budget constraints, the FY 2014-15 has remained at \$1,000, limiting eligible contributions for council. The remaining fund balance is \$800.00.

RESOLUTION No. 2755

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORCORAN
REQUESTING ACTION BY CONGRESS ON DROUGH LEGISLATION.**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Corcoran is acutely aware of the importance of a reliable, secure and safe water supply to the health, prosperity, and well being of its citizens. Further, the City Council understands that, not only its own water supply, but that of the entire surrounding region, has a direct impact on the City; and

WHEREAS, the well-being of the City of Corcoran and its citizens being integrally connected to the well-being of the water supply for the surrounding region, the City has interest in ensuring that the water supply of the major water and irrigation districts that surround the City is protected and promoted; and

WHEREAS, an integral part of the total water supply for the region surrounding the City is water delivered under a federal Central Valley Project contract of the sort that has been enjoyed by the Friant Division irrigation districts located along the East Side of the San Joaquin Valley; and

WHEREAS, this water supply has been withheld from Friant contractors this year for the first time in the more than 60 years that such water contracts and deliveries have existed; and

WHEREAS, this year's zero water supply allocation for Friant Division contractors is already having dramatic negative impacts on the groundwater levels of the region; and

WHEREAS, this year's zero water supply allocation is directly tied to failed management by state and federal agencies of the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta, as a result of imbalanced implementation of the federal Endangered Species Act, preventing typical water deliveries to the San Joaquin River Exchange Contractors and compelling said Exchange Contractors to receive San Joaquin River water that would normally have been delivered to East Side water users; and

WHEREAS, just as the City and its residents have been forced to adopt progressively aggressive conservation measures to adapt to the current period of drought, so too should the agencies who manage resources for the benefit of wildlife and environmental interests; and

WHEREAS, the City of Corcoran concurs with the elected leaders of the City's irrigation and water district neighbors, who have concluded that a more balanced implementation of the Endangered Species Act in the Delta and a greater focus on environmental water conservation would have resulted in a modest water supply for Friant this year, rather than the current zero allocation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Corcoran has a direct and keen interest in development of legislation that cures the mismanagement of the Delta, and ensures that a zero-allocation for Friant Division contractors will not happen in the future.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that action in Congress must be taken immediately if another year of regulatory drought is to be avoided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Corcoran applauds members of the House of Representatives and the United States Senate for passing two separate measures that offer hope of fixing the management problems in the Delta that have led to the Friant Division's zero allocation: Senate passage of S. 2198, the Emergency Drought Relief Act, and House passage of H.R. 3964, the Sacramento-San Joaquin Valley Emergency Water Delivery Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Corcoran urges California's delegation to both Houses of Congress to immediately conclude negotiations and arrive at a joint Drought Relief measure that can be adopted by both houses of Congress and signed by the President.
